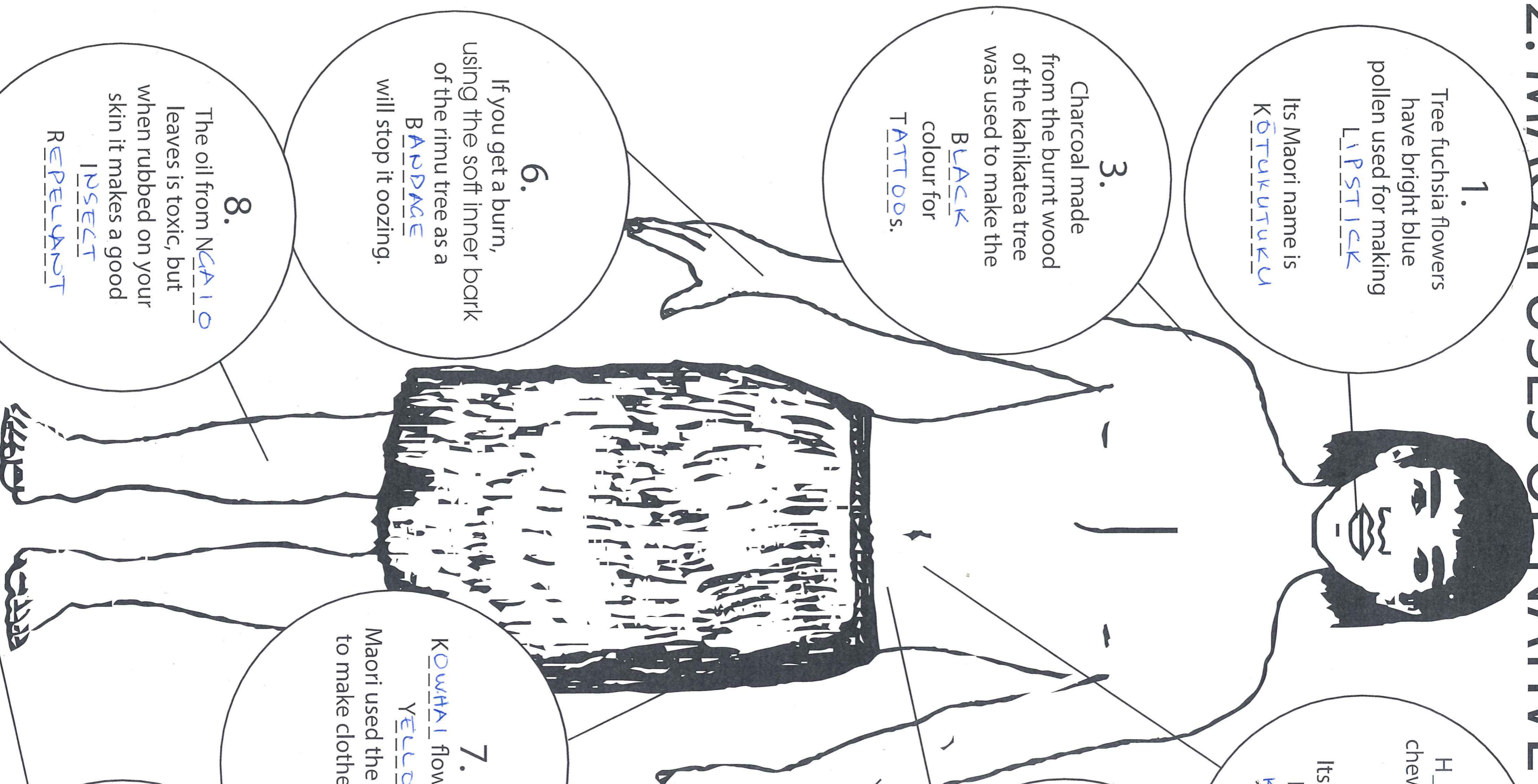


2. MĀORI USES OF NATIVE PLANTS



1.
Tree fuchsia flowers have bright blue pollen used for making LIPSTICK

Its Maori name is KŌTUKUTUKU

2.
H_____ leaves were chewed to help cure diarrhoea.

Its Maori name is KŌKOHUKA or KOROHIKŌ

3.
Charcoal made from the burnt wood of the kahikatea tree was used to make the

BLACK colour for TATTOOS.

4.
For tummy aches, you can drink the boiled juice of papauma leaves. Another name for this plant is

BROADLEAF

5.
If you break a bone, you can use the light, strong wood of the TOTARA tree to make a splint while it heals.

6.
If you get a burn, using the soft inner bark of the rimu tree as a BANDAGE will stop it oozing.

7.
KŌWHAI flowers are YELLOW. Maori used the flowers to make clothes dye!

8.
The oil from ŌHIAŌ leaves is toxic, but when rubbed on your skin it makes a good

INSECT REPELLENT

9.
Harakeke (F_L_A_X) has strong fibres that can be stripped and twisted into STRIPES. This can be woven into clothes and mats.
