



BUTTERFLY



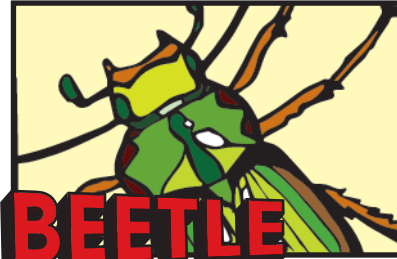
- Long sucking mouthparts
- Drink small amounts of nectar
- Good sense of smell
- Colour, ultraviolet and infra-red vision!
- Seek food during the day



BIRD



- Flower-feeders have long thin beaks and tongues
- Drink lots of nectar, eat fruit and bugs on flowers
- Poor sense of smell in flower-feeders
- Good colour vision, some see ultraviolet too!
- Feed during the day, especially morning time



BEETLE



- Chewing mouthparts
- Eat sap, fruit, pollen, petals. Drink nectar.
- Good sense of smell
- Poor vision
- Seek food day or night depending on beetle



MOTH



- Long sucking mouthparts
- Drink small amounts of nectar
- Good sense of smell
- Good night vision
- Most seek food at night



WIND



- No mouth, just a lot of breath!
- Does not seek out food
- Has no sense of smell
- Not attracted by sight
- Blows day and night, pollinates by chance



RAT



- Long muzzles, chewing mouthparts
- Drink large amounts of nectar, eat fruit and seeds
- Good sense of smell
- Poor colour vision
- Seek food at night



BEE



- Long sucking mouthparts
- Drink nectar, collect pollen
- Fantastic sense of smell
- Good colour vision, sees ultra-violet but not red
- Seek food during the day



BAT



- Long muzzles and tongues
- Drink lots of nectar, eat pollen and fruit
- Average sense of smell
- Very poor eyesight, use echo-location
- Seek food at night
